



Many of us find bus maps absolutely fascinating and can find a way to read them, even when the information is rather complicated, very convoluted and extremely crowded.

Many of us also remember (with a degree of nostalgia) the old London Transport bus maps of the 1950s and 1960s that were just that. Nevertheless, we managed to negotiate our way round the red Central Area with them and gradually learnt what routes went where.

Mike Harris has a soft spot for these maps and has been producing for a number of years each then current bus network (including night buses, schools services and other operators' routes) in this old LT style, and it would seem lots of enthusiasts love them.
